ACADEMIC TEACHING

Fall, 2007 | <u>Nursing 100. Perspectives in Nursing (3 credits)</u> . This is a lower division course designed to introduce the student to the concepts of health and illness as they relate to the health care system and to society. This course provides an overview of health and health care services, relating historical events and social movements to developments in nursing and the health professions. Emerging roles of the professional nurse in health care are explored. Interrelationships of nurses and other members of the health team are considered. |

2003, 2002, | <u>Nursing 316 Principles of Nursing Care (3 credits) Junior Level</u> . Considers selected ethical, legal and epidemiological issues of significance to nursing, |

- 2001, 2000 in order to understand principles of nursing care of individuals within the community. Preparation for practice provided in relation to illness prevention and health maintenance and restoration using the nursing process.
- Fall, 2000 Exercise Science 297B Special Topics: Human Physiology. The Nervous System. The class is a human physiology course designed for exercise science, nutrition, and nursing undergraduate students. The course includes five sections each taught by an expert in the area.
- Fall 2006, 2003, 2002 Nursing 316 Principles of Nursing Honors Section (1 credit) Junior Level
The focus of Nursing 316, Health Promotion is learning the nursing process as well as health promotion activities. The students in the honors section will work together in small groups to apply concepts learned in the general course to a comprehensive assessment of the health promotion activities which occur in the campus community. Using the nursing process, the course will culminate with a presentation and written proposal for improvement in the system and measurement of effectiveness.
- Fall, 1999 Nursing 390c Nursing Research (3 credits) Junior Level. This course prepares participants and consumers of nursing research through discussion of research designs and methods, critique of published studies, analysis of various models for utilization, and discussions with practicing nurse researchers. The course builds on knowledge from nursing and related disciplines.
- Fall, 1999 Nursing 390c Honors Nursing Research (1 credit) Junior Level. The course was designed and developed by me to provide students with an opportunity to engage in the process of research. The students used qualitative observation to collect data. Then the students coded the data and developed categories of observed behavior. From these categories the students developed a questionnaire. The administered the questionnaire and then analyzed the results.
- Fall, 1996, 1995 Nursing 398 A: Practicum III (4 Credits) Junior Level This practicum consists of clinical learning experiences in secondary and tertiary care settings. The student provides direct care of clients with acute and chronic health disruptions. Using the nursing process, the student provides nursing care to selected individuals whose relationships with the environment are disrupted in such a way as to affect their ability to perform their usual roles in the family and community.
- Winter, 1999, 1998, 1997, 1996, 1995 Fall, 1994 Nursing 404 Professional Nursing I (3 credits) Second Degree Program. The emphasis of this course will be the professional and scientific development of nursing as a discipline and the role of nursing within the health care system. Selected historical figures and events, cultural traditions, and philosophical thought bearing on the professional and personal life of the nurse will be examined. Moral and ethical issues in nursing practice will be discussed. This is a full semester course designed in a short, intensive format to facilitate immersion in the content and to introduce the student to the cohort admitted to the program. The course has the same expectations for preparation and assignments as a course given over a full semester, the two weeks are organized so as to allow group work between week one and week two.
- Spring, 2000, 1999, 1998, Nursing 406 Nursing Process: Clients with Common Health Disruptions (3 credits) Second Degree Program. This course will develop a theoretical

- 1997, 1996 foundation for nursing practice, introducing nursing process and the underlying rationale for fundamentals of nursing practice. Concepts from the humanities, social, behavioral and natural sciences are examined for their applicability to nursing. Nursing process is applied to the care of clients throughout the life-span who are either at risk for or are experiencing common disruptions of health.
- Spring, 1999, 1998, 1997, 1996, 1995, 1994 Nursing 407 - Clinical Practice I (4 credits) Second Degree Program This clinical course provides opportunities for experience in application of nursing knowledge through nursing process, and development of fundamental nursing skills. Clinical experiences will be offered primarily in secondary care settings including community hospitals, long-term care and/or rehabilitation facilities with clients across the life span. The emphasis is on health promotion and nursing care of individuals across the life span who are experiencing, or at risk for, common health disruptions.
- Fall, 2009, Spring 2009, Fall 2008, Spring, 2003 2002 Nursing 433 (490P) Community Health Nursing IV: Restorative II (3 credits) Senior level. This required theory course is focused on concepts of restorative nursing care for groups of individuals with complex health disruptions, which include illnesses that coexist and cause acute exacerbations of chronic illnesses.
- Spring 2001 Nursing 491 Comprehensive Nursing II (Second Degree Program) This theory course which accompanies a practice course designed to provide new learning about the health care system, the evolving science of nursing, and the nursing process as the systematic approach and foundation of professional nursing practice. The students' theoretical basis for practice is broadened on several dimensions: application of theories and concepts, expansion of interpersonal skills, and assimilation of professional values and beliefs.
- Spring, 2009, 2008, 2003, 2002, 2001, 1999, 1998, 1997, 1996 Nursing 498A Internship Second Degree Program (9 credits). The emphasis of this clinical experience is integration of nursing knowledge in a clinical practice setting and transition from student to professional role. The student completes 320 hours of clinical experiences working directly under the guidance and mentoring of a qualified registered nurse in an area of student interest.
- Summer 1995 1994 Nursing 590G Professional Practice II: Family Health and Community Nursing (4 credits) Second Degree Program This clinical course provides opportunities for experience in application of nursing knowledge in the care of families of all ages through the nursing process. Emphasis will be upon assessment and planning interventions for families with actual or potential health problems. Clinical experiences will occur in several different settings, including clinics, inpatient facilities, client's homes, and local hospitals.
- Spring 2004 Nursing 648 Concepts of Healthy Aging (3 credits). Examination of concepts and theories related to human responses to biophysical, psychosocial, and cultural phenomena that have an impact on advanced nursing practice with healthy older adults. Advances in the art and science of nursing, related to current research, clinical therapeutics, and nursing care evaluation strategies will be examined and analyzed.

- Spring 2006 Nursing 668 Advanced Practice Nursing for Older Adults/ Chronic Care (3 credits). This seminar is organized to analyze concepts, theories, and research related to advanced practice nursing of adults and elderly individuals with chronic health care needs.
- Spring 2006 Nursing 798G Advanced Clinical Practicum for Older Adults/ Chronic Care (3 credits). Supervised advanced practica provide intensive clinical experience in care for older adults with chronic illnesses.
- Fall 2002, 2008
Spring, 2007, 2008, 2009 Nursing 730 Qualitative Research Methods (3 credits). The focus of this seminar is the use of qualitative research methods to build substantive knowledge in nursing. Issues in qualitative research are identified and discussed. Critical analysis of traditional and emerging designs are debated. Selected qualitative research designs will be presented, the philosophical underpinnings and specific data collection and analysis methods associated with each design are identified, discussed, compared, contrasted and analyzed. Research from Nursing and other fields will be critiqued. Experiential learning of methods and techniques include design, preparation and presentation of a research project.
- Fall 2007 Nursing 797C: Special Topics in Aging Research (3 credits). Older adults have unique needs in relation to the health care system. Scientists specializing in research relating to older adults need specialized knowledge to affectively work with this population This course provides an indepth, interdisciplinary examination of select issues important for older adults.
- Fall 2003 Nursing 810 Advanced Research Methods (3 credits). This course emphasizes a synthesis of the core courses in the doctoral program through the development of a formal grant proposal. N810 explores the elements of grant writing, proposal development and ethical considerations related to human subjects research. Students will be guided in the development of an individual grant proposal eligible for submission to a funding sponsor.
